The entertainment tent has a Search for Talent everyday (except Sunday) at the fair. Wildman Jack and Vocal Trash take the stage throughout the week. On Sunday, the NYS Fiddle Contest will take place at 3:30pm.

The rides at the fair always provide great entertainment to people of all ages. This year's ride lineup includes the classic rides, but new rides such as Khaos, Sizzler and Charlie Chopper are part of additions will add new flavor to the thrills. A six day pass is available at the Fair Office for \$50. Children 11 years and under are free at all times. Parking is free.
