RULES - Entries Close August 1st

1. All general rules apply. Please read them. ONE entry per class per exhibitor

2. No entries will be accepted from Dealers.

3. To qualify: item must be over 75 years old to be determined by judges; be distinguished by its rarity or quality of workmanship; must be clean and not be antiques or otherwise made to appear old.

4. NO REPRODUCTIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

5. Each entry should be tagged with a card giving its age and any information regarding its history that may be of interest to the judge and public.

6. In general, other points being equal, the judge will give preference to (1) article made in America, (2) those made in New York State, and (3) those with the names of the maker attached.
