## Class No. 1 Ugly Sock Creatures

Supplies:

- A sock (feel free to reuse ones that have no mate)
- Filling-rice +/or fiberfill
- Thread
- Needles
- Buttons, felt, ribbons etc for embellishments.

Directions:

1. Pour in a cup of rice, beans, sand etc. for bottom weight.
2. stuff with filling until desired height- tie or stitch top.
3. Add embellishments, felt, ribbon yarns to create a creature of your design. (do not use buttons for kids under 3 as they could be a choking hazard.)


## STEAM Classes

Class No. 2. 11. 35.
Repurposed Sock Gnomes (maximum size 6" x 4") Directions:

1. Fill a sock with $11 / 2$ cups of rice, sand, beans etc. and add filling as desired for height. Tie a knot at the top.
2. Starting at the cuff of a sock- sew a diagonal to the heel of the sock to make the hat. You can stuff the hat, add a wire (make the end a loop so it doesn't poke through) or let it be floppy. You can add embellishments around the cuff.
3. Cover the body of the gnome with a mismatched sock if desired.
4. Cut a 4-5 inch triangle of fake fur or use yarn to make a beard. sew it under the hat brim.
5. Add a wooden ball or pompom for a nose.

Be creative- you can make gnome animals by adding ears to the hat, or you can add accessories like flowers or pitchforks to their sides for themed gnomes. Remember no glue.

SKILL LEVEL: Easy (Level 2) SIZE: One Size, About $151 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. $(39.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) wide $\times 11 \mathrm{in}$. ( 28.5 cm ) tall, not including Straps
MATERIALS :
640-149 Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick \& Quick Yarn: 3 balls
Lion Brand Knitting Needles - Size 10.5 [ 6.5 mm ]
Lion Brand Cable Needles (Set of 2)
Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)
Additional Materials Wood dowel, $1 / 2 \mathrm{in} .(13 \mathrm{~mm})$ diameter and $24 \mathrm{in} .(61 \mathrm{~cm})$ long. $2 \mathrm{yds} .(2 \mathrm{~m})$ of $1 \mathrm{in} .(25 \mathrm{~mm})$ wide grosgrain ribbon to match yarn color. Sewing needle and thread.
*Wool-Ease Thick \& Quick (Article \#640). Solids, Heathers, Twists: 80\% Acrylic, 20\% wool.
Wheat \& Wood: 86\% Acrylic; 10\% Wool; 4\% Rayon
Oatmeal \& Barley \& Grey Marble: 82\% Acrylic; 10\% Wool; 8\% Rayon
Metallics: 79\% Acrylic, 20\% Wool, 1\% Metallic Poly; package size: Solids, Heathers, Twists, Tweeds: 6 oz./170g (106 yd/97 m)
Prints, Stripes: 5 oz./140g (87 yd/80 m) Metallics: 5 oz./140g (92 yd/84 m)

## GAUGE:

15 sts +17 rows $=$ about 4 in. $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in Cable Pattern.
When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.
Making a Gauge Swatch, STITCH EXPLANATION:
3/3 LC (3 over 3 left cross) Slip 3 sts to cable needle and hold in front, k3, then k3 from cable needle.
$3 / 3$ RC ( 3 over 3 right cross) Slip 3 sts to cable needle and hold in back, k3, then k3 from cable needle.
Notes:

1. Bag is worked in 4 pieces: Back, Front, and 2 Straps.
2. Back and Front are identical. Both are worked in a Cable Pattern with a casing at top edge. The casing is folded and seamed to create a sleeve for the dowels.
3. Straps are worked separately, then reinforced with grosgrain ribbon and sewn to Bag.
4. Cable Pattern can be worked by following written instructions or by reading the Chart. If working from Chart, read RS rows of chart from right to left and WS rows from left to right.


BACK: Cable Pattern, Cast on 59 sts.
Row 1 (RS): P1, k1, *p2, k9, p2, k1; rep from * 3 more times, p1. Row 2: K1, *p1, k2, p9, k2; rep from * 3 more times, p1, k1. Row 3: P1, k1, *p2, 3/3 LC, k3, p2, k1; rep from * 3 more times, p1. Row 4: Rep Row 2. Rows 5 and 6: Rep Rows 1 and 2. Row 7: P1, k1, *p2, k3, 3/3 RC, p2, k1; rep from * 3 more times, p1. Row 8: Rep Row 2. Rows 9-40: Rep Rows 1-8. Rows 41-44: Rep Rows 1-4. Casing
Row 1 (RS): (K2tog) twice, *k1, (k2tog) twice; rep from * across - 35 sts at the end of this row. Beginning with a WS (purl) row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 7 rows. Bind off.
FRONT: Make same as Back. STRAPS (make 2) Cast on 4 sts. Work in Garter st (k every row) until piece measures about 24 in. (61 $\mathrm{cm})$ from beg. Bind off.

## FINISHING

With WS of Back and Front tog, sew cast-on edges tog for bottom of Bag. Sew side edges of Back and Front tog, beg at lower edge and ending about 3 in. $(7.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ below first row of casing. Fold Front casing in half toward the inside of Bag and sew edge of casing to inside of Bag. Rep with Back casing. Sew one end of Front Casing closed. Cut dowel to the same length as Front casing and slide into casing. Sew rem end of Front casing closed. Rep to insert dowel into Back casing.
Cut 2 lengths of ribbon, each the same length as Strap. With sewing needle and thread, sew a length of ribbon to one side of ribbon to one side of each Strap. This is the WS of the Strap.
Pin ends of one Strap to WS of Front, about $1 \mathrm{in} .(2.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ in from sides and 1 in . $(2.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ below top edge. Sew in place. Rep to attach 2nd Strap to Back.
Weave in ends

- LION BRAND® WOOL-EASE® ROVING ORIGINS (Art. \#647)
- \#143, 2 balls
- LION BRAND® stitch markers

## ABBREVIATIONS:

| beg = begin(ning) | sc $=$ single crochet |

SIZING: Finished Width About $14 \mathrm{in} .(35.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ Finished. Length About $16 \mathrm{in} .(40.5 \mathrm{~cm})$, not including handles.

## GAUGE:

15 sts +17 rows = about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ over pattern in Rows 1 and 2 of Bag (Grit st pattern). BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.
NOTES: Bag is made as a rectangle, then folded and seamed. The pattern stitch is a simple-to-work Grit stitch. Top Edging is worked in rnds directly onto Bag. Handles are worked separately and sewn to Bag.

BAG: Ch 53. Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, * sk next ch, 2 sc in next ch; rep from * to last ch, sc in last ch - you will have 52 sc in this row (twenty-five 2-sc groups, and 1 sc at beg and end of row). Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, * sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from * to last sc, sc in last sc. Rep Row 2 until piece measures about $28 \mathrm{in} .(71 \mathrm{~cm})$ from beg. Fasten off. Fold rectangle in half, bringing foundation ch and last row together for top of Bag.
Note: Grit st pattern is reversible, choose whichever side of Bag you prefer for outside of Bag. Sew side edges together.
Top Edging: Rnd 1: From outside of Bag, draw up a loop of yarn in top edge at one side seam, ch 1, work 52 sc evenly spaced along top edge of Bag to next side seam then work 52 more sc evenly spaced along top edge to end of rnd; do not join, work in continuous rnds (spiral) - 104 sc . Place marker in last sc made to indicate end of rnd. Move marker up as each rnd is completed.
Rnds 2-8: Sc in each st around. Rnd 9: Working in front loops only, sl st in each st around. Fasten off.
HANDLES (make 2)
Leaving a long beg tail for sewing, ch 6. Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across -5 sc. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 24 in . 61 cm ) from beg. Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail for sewing.

## FINISHING

Sew ends of Handles to inside top edge of Bag, sewing one Handle onto front and one onto back with ends about 4 in . (10 cm) apart. Weave in ends.


[^0]:    RULES - Entries Close August 1st

    1. All the General Rules apply, please read them carefully.
    2. MAXIMUM TWO entries per class per exhibitor, unless noted
    3. The name of the maker or initials should not appear on the article. It must be removed or completely covered with tape or cloth.
    4. Only needlework and stitched articles may be entered. NO GLUE, INCLUDING ALL ACCESSORIES.
    5. Framed articles are measured inside the frame or if matted, from inside the mat. Maximum size $\mathbf{2 4}$ inches $\mathbf{x} \mathbf{3 6}$ inches for all classes.
    6. Wall hangings must be equipped WITH proper hanging device, or rod sleeve.
    7. When rods are necessary for wall hangings and hooked pieces, they must be firmly secured to the article so they do not slip out.
    8. Any needlework pieces may be unframed.
    9. Attention Quilters: If you paid for quilting, please put on your tag the name of the professional quilter. This applies to professionally quilted classes that have been entered.
    10. All items submitted must be completed within the last 12 months.
    11. All items should be clean and free of stains or odors.
