Rules - Entries close August 1st

- 1. Before making entries, read Standard No. 350.0 in this Premium Book, Rules and Regulations of the Department of Agriculture and Markets.
- 2. Positively no entries accepted after the entry deadline. If no space is available, you will be notified by August 13.
- 3. All animals must be in place Monday, August 19th at 7:00pm but not before Sunday, August 18th, 3:00pm and remain until 8:00pm Sunday evening, the last day of the fair.
- 4. No exhibitor except 4-H members going to the state fair may be released before 8pm Sunday, the last day of the fair, without permission from the superintendent.
- 5. All sheep must have been owned by the individual exhibitor 30 days prior to the show.
- 6. All purebred sheep must be registered with the breed association of the breed they are showing in and have valid registration certificate available to show at check in.
- 7. Each sheep must have appropriate, USDA approved ear tags or tattoos corresponding with registration papers. Ear tags or tattoos must be in the ear and will be checked on show day.
- 8. Each exhibitor shall present to the superintendent upon arrival, a health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian indicating that the flock is free of all contagious or infectious diseases and is not under quarantine. Proof of rabies vaccination is required at all NYS Fairs for those species that a USDA licensed vaccine is available.
- 9. Individual breeds will be shown separately if one exhibitor flock or the minimum of two exhibitors are entered. Any other breed not qualifying will be shown in AOB.
- 10. One entry per exhibitor will be allowed in pair and group classes. Group class animals must be entered in their individual class and registered under the same name.
- 11. Only two animals, per class, per exhibitor.
- 12. Lamb classes will be split for spring and fall lambs. The date of the split is September 1 and January 1.
- 13. All market lambs must be slick shorn before being weighed in at 5:30 pm on Tuesday, August 20th.
- 14. Wether sires and dams will be shown slick shorn. Sheep shown in the wether dam class cannot be in the market class. Wether and dam may be pure or crossbred. All purebred and crossbred will be shown together.
- 15. To maintain our show's credibility any attempts to artificially change the degree of firmness of any market lamb shall be considered unacceptable and will be disqualified.
- 16. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to keep the area around their pens clean and neat.
- 17. Exhibitors are encouraged to display farm signs. Other signs will not be allowed.
- 18. Exhibitors will not be allowed to wash their sheep except in the two designated wash areas.
- 19. The interpretation for qualification or disqualification will be determined by the superintendent.
- 20. Sheep will always have clean water.
- 21. Sheep will receive 2 bales of shavings or 1 bale of straw per pen. A 20 yard container will be available to put waste in during the day.

NATURAL COLORED SHEEP SHOW RULES

General rules will apply for this show except as follows:

- 1. This show is not open to registered sheep shown in previous classes.
- 2. All sheep must be identified by legible tattoo or farm ear tag.
- 3. The judging of colored sheep will be 40% conformation, 60% wool.
- 4. The judging of wool will be based on its quality for hand spinning. However, adequate size and muscling and soundness must be evident.
- 5. It's the exhibitor's responsibility to determine before the show, which class the animal should be in, not the Judges!
- Some class examples: Rambouillet, Merino, Corriedale and Columbias are fine and medium sheep. Romneys and Border-Leicesters are long wools. These are the usual examples. Depending on breeding, classes may change.

- 12. Get-of-Sire (3 animals sired by same ram and both sexes represented).

All the animals entered in group classes must be entered in single classes and all registered in the same name.

- 13. Market Lamb-will be broken down by weight 75-160 lbs. Champion Market Lamb Reserve Champion Market Lamb
- 14. Pair of Market Lambs Market Lamb classes to be grade or purebred ewe, wether, under 1 yr. of age and will be judged for meat qualities according to market standards regardless of breeding. May not be shown in any other class except market. It's the exhibitor's responsibility to get their market lambs to the scale. Market lambs will be weighed at 5 pm Tuesday, August 20th, All Market lambs must be slick shorn before being weighed in. To be eligible to be shown, market lambs must weigh between 75-160 lbs. No more than four lambs per exhibitor.

Best of Show

Contests will be held Thursday and Friday after their respective shows. Open to breed Champions rams and ewes.

Best Fleece

Each exhibitor may enter one previously shown sheep of their choosing to compete for Best Fleece

JUNIOR SHEEP SHOW

Additional Junior Premiums for All Breed Shows The Junior Show will be judged simultaneously with the Open Show.

The Dutchess County Fair/Dutchess County Agricultural Society will be offering Junior Exhibitors additional premiums for single classes in all breed shows.

> 1st - \$12, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - through 6th - \$4. Every animal after 6th place will receive \$2.00 Group classes are exempt.

Rules: Entry Fee: \$2 - Exhibitors must enter the Jr. Sheep Show online when making open entries by the closing date of August 1st.

- The animal must be owned in the individual junior name. No family, farm names or partnerships with adults allowed. Sheep entered must be registered in the junior exhibitor's name or be in the process of being registered to the junior exhibitor before June 1st. Futurity are welcome. No lease animals will be allowed.
- Junior Sheep entries must be entered in the Open Sheep Show.
- The junior exhibitor cannot be older than 21 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. Please put age on the entry form. The junior exhibitor must be present on show day and be actively participating in showing their animal(s) in the show ring at all times. Junior exhibitors must be old enough to handle their own sheep, understand and take direction from the judge, and show at the head of one of their animals in the ring. A maximum of two animals per class will be allowed. Another junior must be showing the second animal. The junior must also be present at sheep check in as well.
- Please note the Junior Exhibitors will still be eligible for open show premiums and awards, as long as all animals are owned by that Junior Exhibitor.
- All other Open Sheep Show rules apply.

- a) There must be at least 2 contestants to have a class, otherwise classes will be combined.
- b) Sheep must be ewes, fitted, and trained to show at halter.
- c) Leader attired in an outfit, at least one article is 100% wool.
- d) Entrants should have a sheep or wool interest.

Pre-judging of garment construction and interview of the leader will take place Friday afternoon at 3pm in the Sheep Show Ring. Classes will be held on Friday, August 23rd, at 4pm in the Sheep Show Ring.
